## Leader in Occupation Of Alcatraz Shot Dead

SANTA ROSA, Calif., Sept. 20 (AP)—Richard Oakes, a leader in an Indian occupation of Alcatraz Island in San Francisco Bay, was shot to death today, the District Attorney reported.

Sonoma County sheriff's deputies arrested Michael Morgan on investigation of manslaughter, District Attorney John Hawk said. Mr. Morgan is connected with the Young Men's Christian Association camp at which Mr. Oakes was shot, District Attorney Hawk said. Details of the eshooting were unavailable.

The camp is on the coast near the town of Annapolis about 60 miles northwest of here.

Indians occupied Alcatraz, a former Federal prison, from Nov. 20, 1969, until Federal officials removed them June 11, 1971. The occupation was in support of a demand that the vacated prison be turned into an Indian cultural center. The Government, however, rejected the demand.
