AN OPEN LETTER TO / REPRESENTATIVES IN ALBANY

September 18, 1968

To: Senator Manfred Ohrenstein Assembly William Passannante

The Citizens' Advisory Council on the Status of Women is "convinced that the right of a woman to determine her own reproductive life is a basic human right" and "recommends that laws making abortion a criminal offense be REPEALED."

Who else? ACLU, Amer. for Democratic Action, Nat'l Org. for Women (NOW) Women's City Club of New York, AFL/CIO and AFL/CIO Legislative Committee in NYC, Nat'l Cluncil of Churches, Nat'l Council of Negro Women, Nat'l Academy of Sciences, Reform Democratic Clubs --FDR-Woodrow Wilson, Murray Hill, Lenox Hill and Riverside Democrats.

> Assemblywoman Constance Cook of Ithaca will introduce a bill to repeal the abortion law in 1969. You both say the law should be changed and both co-sponsored reform last year. Why do you both refuse to co-sponsor a bill to repeal the law in 1969?

- ....Why do you <u>both</u> favor abortions for some women and deny others? (Your bill would exclude 85% of women seeking abortions)
- ....Why do you both force a woman to have a child against her will? (Isn't this cruel and unusual punishment?)
- ....Why do you <u>both</u> fail to stand up for separation of church and state? (True freedom of religion requires that the dogma of one group not be imposed on those with other views)
- Why do you both force women to the demeaning process of petitioning and pleading to qualify for an abortion? (Isn't this a private matter?)
- ....Why do you, our "reform" representatives in Albany, not lead the fight for this major social reform? (Why are you so far behind a Republican from upstate?)
- ....95.4% of all women believe in abortion on request? Will you represent the women too in 1969?
