1. Engage in an extensive voter education campaign in Roxbury. (Our voter registration project brought close to 3,000 new voters.)
2. Expand our career guidance program to include the average student and under-employed youth.
3. Strengthen line of communication with employment and unions.
4. Explore new avenues of employment.
5. Encourage "stay-ins" in education and diminish "drop-outs".
6. Establish a Civil Rights information and communication center.
7. Employ a qualified man who will devote his entire efforts to the above program.
