- 3. Strengthen line of communication with employment and unions.
- 4. Explore new avenues of employment.
- 5. Encourage "stay-ins" in education and diminish "drop-outs".
- 6. Establish a Civil Rights information and communication center.
- 7. Employ a qualified man who will devote his entire efforts to the above program.
